To minimize the adversity caused by natural disasters, the relevant actors need to plan beyond the immediate response and work closely with geologists, environmentalists, and researchers to examine, assess, and review potential future climate risks to timely alert the decision-makers, said Shabnam Baloch, IRC's Country Director. She said it is equally impor-

tant to understand that natural calamities further aggravate the vulnerability of women and girls and so, any response or management efforts must be designed keeping their unique protection issues in mind.

While speaking about the response, Muhammad Sharif, IRC's Head of Office, Balochistan, said our efforts are geared towards providing maximum possible relief to those most in need. We have so far set up three free medical

camps in the flood-affected areas.

More than 500 Afghan refugees and host communities have so far availed the services, shared Esfandiyar Baloch, CEO PPHI, while giving details of the relief operations. He said that under this rapid response, more than 350 food packages and over 250 dignity kits are being distributed among the affected population.

According to the assistant commissioner, the wards and

emergency room of Muslim Bagh Civil Hospital were flooded, while rain in the hilly areas of Muslim Bagh damaged more than 100 houses. Most of the access roads to remote areas of Qila Saifullah, Zhob, and Harnai have been affected, hampering rescue operations in several areas.

A Pishin administration official said hundreds of mud-houses were washed away or badly damaged in Malikyar, Don Khanozai and Sheikhalzai areas of Pishin as

floodwater coming from hilly areas of Burshor lashed the area.

بندی کرنے اور ماہرین ارضیات، ماہرین ماحولیات اور محققین کے ساتھ مل کر کام کرنے کی ضرورت ہے تاکہ مستقبل کے ممکنہ ماحولیاتی خطرات کا بروقت جائزہ لیا جا سکے۔" اس قدرتی آفت سے صوبے کی سطح پر خواتین اور بچوں سمیت 77 سے زائد افراد کے جاں بحق ہونے کی اطلاع ہے جب کہ زخمیوں کی تعداد 100 سے تجاوز کر گئی ہے۔ ابتدائی اطلاعات کے مطابق صوبے میں کم از کم 150,000 افراد کو فوری امدادی ضرورت ہے جبکہ 30,000 افراد شدید متاثر ہیں۔ صوبائی دارالحکومت کوئٹہ میں ہنگامی حالت کا اعلان کر دیا گیا ہے۔ اسسٹنٹ کمشنر کے مطابق مسلم باغ سول ہسپتال کے وارڈ اور ایمرجنسی سنٹر میں پانی بھر گیا جب کہ مسلم باغ کے پہاڑی علاقوں میں بارش سے 100 سے زائد مکانات کو نقصان پہنچا ہے۔ گلہری سیف اللہ ڈوب اور ہرنائی کے دور دراز علاقوں تک جانے والی زیادہ تر سڑکیں سیلاب سے متاثر ہیں، جس کی وجہ سے ان علاقوں میں امدادی کارروائیوں میں مشکلات کا سامنا کرنا پڑ رہا ہے۔ پشین انتظامیہ کے ایک اہلکار کے مطابق پشین کے علاقوں مالکیار، ڈان خانوڑی اور شیخ طرکی میں سینکڑوں کچے مکانات یا تو بے گھر گئے ہیں یا انہیں بری طرح سے نقصان پہنچا ہے۔ ماضی کے تجربات اور قدرتی آفات کے خطرات کی بنیاد پر، حکومت بلوچستان اور متعلقہ سرکاری اور غیر سرکاری اداروں کو ہنگامی حالات سے نمٹنے کے لیے ایک جامع حکمت عملی تیار کرنے کی ضرورت ہے۔ انٹرنیشنل ریسکیو کمیٹی نے ماضی میں بھی اسی طرح کے ہنگامی حالات میں خوراک، گھریلو استعمال کی اہم اشیاء اور بنیادی صحت کے کیمپوں کے ذریعے متاثرہ آبادیوں کو مدد فراہم کی ہے۔ انٹرنیشنل ریسکیو کمیٹی اس وقت ضلعی اور صوبائی حکام کے ساتھ بھی رابطہ میں ہے تاکہ انہیں امدادی سرگرمیوں کے حوالے سے باخبر رکھا جاسکے۔

کم از کم 150,000 افراد کو فوری امداد کی ضرورت؛ تیزی

سے گزرتی ہوئی صورتحال کے پیش نظر کوئٹہ میں ایمرٹلی کا نفاذ کوئٹہ، جولائی 13، 2022ء کو موٹا دھار بارشوں کی وجہ سے آنے والے شدید سیلاب سے بلوچستان میں پڑے پیمانے پر تباہی آئی ہے۔ اس کے نتیجے میں بلوچستان حکومت نے سوہ بھر میں امدادی کارروائیوں کے کام کا تیزی سے آغاز کر دیا ہے۔ اس تیزی سے گزرتی ہوئی صورتحال کے پیش نظر عمید کی تعطیلات کے دوران ہی انٹرنیشنل ریسکیو کمیٹی نے فوری طور پر ہنگامی حالات سے نمٹنے کے لیے بلوچستان کے اضلاع پشین اور کوئٹہ میں امدادی سرگرمیوں کا آغاز کیا۔ محمد شریف، انٹرنیشنل ریسکیو کمیٹی کے ہیڈ آف آفس نے بتایا کہ ہم اب تک سیلاب سے متاثرہ علاقوں میں 3 مفت میڈیکل کیمپ لگانے میں کامیاب ہو چکے ہیں جن سے 500 سے زائد افغان مہاجرین اور میان گھرانے مستفید ہو چکے ہیں، اس رسپانس کے تحت متاثرہ علاقوں میں 350 سے زائد فوڈ کیٹس اور 250 سے زائد ڈگمنٹی کلس بھی تقسیم کی جا چکی ہیں۔ یہ فوری رسپانس جرمن وفاقی دفتر نارچہ کی مالی امداد، انٹرنیشنل ریسکیو کمیٹی کے اندرونی فنڈز، اور ادارے کے سوبائی پارٹنر، ہیڈیلز پرائمری ہیلتھ کیئر انیشیٹیو (پی۔ پی۔ ایچ۔ آئی) کے تعاون سے ممکن ہو پایا۔ ہنگامی بنیادوں پر امدادی سرگرمیوں کا آغاز ایمرٹلی کے نفاذ کے پچھلے گھنٹوں کے اندر سوبائی ڈیپارٹمنٹ اتھارٹی، بلوچستان کے ساتھ مشاورت میں کیا
